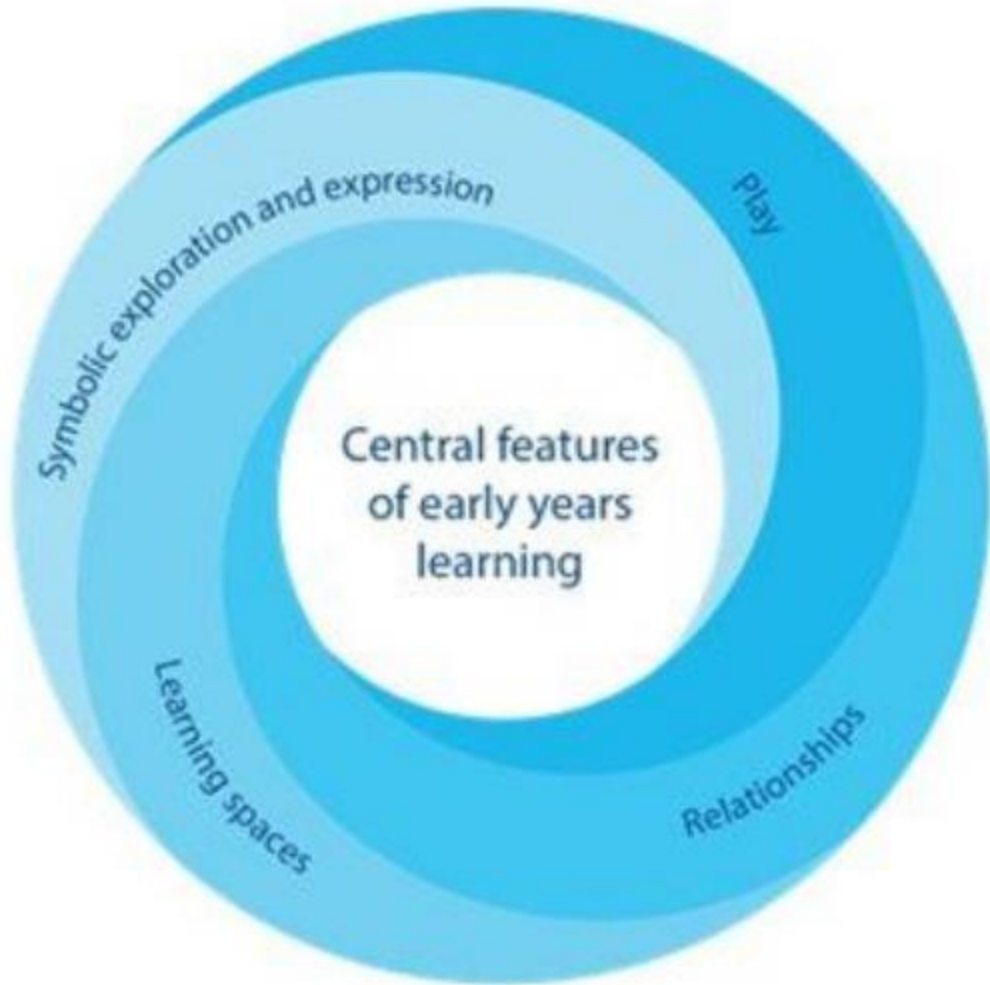

INNOVAMAT MATHS



- A dynamic mathematics program that goes beyond traditional teaching methods, offering a manipulative, competency- based, and meaningful approach
- The importance of manipulatives in the learning process. Manipulatives are physical objects used as teaching tools to engage students in hands-on learning of mathematics.
- Workshops: teachers guide the entire group through a sequence of experiential and manipulative activities, building and sharing new knowledge collectively.
- Spaces: interdisciplinary and manipulative corners presenting a diverse range of mathematical challenges. In these spaces, children put their knowledge into practice, engaging in self-directed learning and autonomous exploration.

PHONICS PROGRAM

- o We will be introducing blending and first readers. Miss Tracey Stanbridge from F5 is responsible for reading levels and is the program coordinator.
- o We will send home words and books weekly once the children are ready and settled into the school routine
- o Resources you can get for home learning: RWI cards
- o Used picture books in English are available on Amazon for a small price if you feel like you need to extend your collection.
- o We will have workshops where you can find out more how to read with your child at home.

HEALTH POLICY

As a general rule for all illnesses that cause fever, **STUDENTS MUST STAY FEVER-FREE FOR 24 HOURS** before returning to school.

Below are the criteria for returning to school for some of the most common infectious diseases at school age:

- Diarrhoea:** You can return between 24-48 hours after the last diarrhoeal stool.
- Pediculosis (head lice):** They can return to school when they no longer have head lice and have undergone anti-lice treatment.
- **Conjunctivitis:** If it is suppurative, he can return to school 24 hours after starting the treatment. If it is not suppurative, he/she can come to school normally.
- Chickenpox:** Until all lesions have crusted over or at least 6 days after the onset of the rash.
- Bacterial tonsillitis requiring antibiotics:** 24 hours after the start of antibiotic treatment.

If families or pupils notify you of any illnesses that are not listed, please contact me, as there are more illnesses that exclude pupils from the school.
